




Neil Young and Promise of the Real album: "The Visitor"




"Through Early Yellowstone: Adventure by Bicycle, Covered Wagon, Foot, Horseback and Skis" edited by Janet Chapple

As visitation in Yellowstone National Park continues to increase, it can be difficult to imagine what the iconic park looked like in its early days, a time when there were more ungulates inside Yellowstone's borders than humans.

Janet Chapple, an Oakland, California-based editor, brings that era to life with annotated travel accounts published from 1871-1928. A scholar and lover of Yellowstone history, Chapple worked on the project for almost 15 years. She paired it with a strong collection of artwork—including a gallery of watercolors from an 1884 trip that's never been exhibited outside of Wales—to further celebrate Yellowstone's visual splendors.


