

December 2004: FOBSE incorporated as a nonprofit organization

2005: FOBSE enrolls 250 people

April 2007: Then-Gov. Brian Schweitzer signs into law a bill enabling small communities such as Big Sky's to hold plebiscite votes to expand school districts from K-8 to K-12

Dec. 2007: Raised \$1 million to match a challenge pledge of \$1 million to build the high school through "Christmas on The Mountain" and a Daniel Powter concert

Feb. 7, 2008: Ophir School Board and FOBSE jointly hold symposium to determine high school curriculum and vision for a high school

August 2009: Funded LPHS opening celebration

2010: FOBSE raises \$100,000 to upgrade track and field, and purchase activities bus

March 2013: WMPAC opens

Feb. – April 2005: FOBSE organized the "Let's Talk, Big Sky" initiative, results in consensus that Big Sky needs a high school

2007 – 2009: FOBSE underwrites private online high school for parents not wanting to send kids to school in Bozeman

July 1, 2008: Ophir School District #72 legally recognized as K-12 school district with plans to open Lone Peak High School in August 2009.

2010 – 2011: FOBSE teams with Strings Under the Big Sky to bring classical music to school district

2011: FOBSE begins capital campaign to raise funds to build WMPAC
